

Supplies Needed:

- magazines
- skewer
- white glue
- scissors
- cardboard
- round items (pen, pencil, glue stick etc.)



Take your magazine and cut each page in half down the middle

Take a single strip of paper, place your skewer at an angle at one corner. Roll the paper over the skewer. Move the skewer as you roll so the skewer is easier to remove. As you reach the end, put a dab of glue on the paper to finish. Repeat until you have lots of paper tubes.



Make more paper tubes than you think you will need

To make a ring or circle, take your paper tube and start wrapping it around something round. The tube will flatten as you go. The larger the round thing, the larger the hole will be in the centre of your ring. Use a pencil or pen or glue stick or whatever you have handy. Dab some glue on as you go so it holds its shape.







Experiment with different shapes

Use glue to attach your rings and tubes to a piece of cardboard for a picture frame or try making a bowl or different shapes like paper quilling to make a unique design.
