The Clerk's Department is pleased to introduce a new informational Council electronic newsletter (eNewsletter), the Council Standing Committee Recap. With the introduction of this eNewsletter, the Municipal Clerk hopes to educate and engage the community on matters being considered by Council.

"Transparent governance involves raising greater awareness about the business of the Town of Cobourg so that the members of our community have the tools and information they require to become active citizens," says Brent Larmer, Municipal Clerk and Director of Legislative Services. "Through the recording of all Council meetings and improved communications practices we are making Council deliberations more accessible to all members of the public."

The Council Standing Committee Recap is issued out monthly following the Town of Cobourg Standing Committee meetings and provides a summary of items

being discussed by each Committee. The timing of the eNewsletter will provide readers with approximately two weeks to review the subject matter



before Council considers them for final approval at the Regular Council meeting. Giving residents advance notice to address Council at the Regular Council meeting should they wish to speak to a specific matter or have the item extracted for Council's further consideration.

The eNewsletter will be emailed monthly to the Town of Cobourg corporate newsletter distribution list - the same list as Hello Cobourg!. The newsletter is also shared on the Mayor and Council website monthly and printed copies can be made available at the Clerk's department, first floor of Victoria Hall, upon request.

The Clerk is a statutory officer of the Corporation and is assigned various duties by several Provincial statutes such as the Municipal Act, the Municipal Elections Act and the Vital Statistics Act.

The Town of Cobourg Clerks department oversees the Town's records management system, Freedom of Information requests, conducts municipal elections, prepares Council and Committee agendas and minutes, and oversees Municipal Law Enforcement and Licensing.

The Clerk and Deputy Clerk provide leadership in matters of protocol, and ensure compliance with legal requirements and procedural guidelines, both internally and externally. Through their commitment to exceptional customer service and transparent governance, the Clerks ensure that Council meetings and minutes are open and accessible by the public and are committed to additional community engagement and education.

Department SPOTLIGHT

The Scoop on Snowplowing

The Town of Cobourg Roads and Sewers department staff are always ready to jump into action when the weather forecast shows significant snowfalls.

The roads department is responsible for **117 kilometers** of Town roads. When the snowy weather comes, the department typically deploys six large plow trucks with a plow wing on the passenger side, two large wheel loader with a plow attached, two sidewalk machines, and a pickup truck with a salter for bike paths. Staff members are also deployed to clear school crosswalks, and occasionally a grader when necessary.

There are 20 roads and sewer department employees: one manager, 15 General Utility Workers, a supervisor, joint operations clerk (shared with Parks) and an administrative/accounts clerk.

While it may at times seem like it takes a while for the snowplows to get to your residential street, there is a priority system in place to ensure the safety of residents:

1) Emergency Routes and Arterial roads are cleared first due to the high volume of usage and for safety of residents and emergency responders. Examples of these streets include Division Street, William Street and King Street.

2) Collector Street and Bus Routes are secondary for snow clearing and are completed after Class #1 routes have been cleared. Examples of these streets include Chipping Park Boulevard and Westwood Drive.

3) Residential Streets are cleared after Class #1 and Class #2 roadways have been completed. Frei Street and Daintry Crescent are examples of Class #3 streets.

During heavier snowfalls, roads crews operate, on-call, around the clock to ensure Emergency Routes and Arterials roads are maintained.



Keep Roads Clear for Plows

During heavy snowfalls, it is imperative that residents keep their vehicles off the road to ensure that snowplows and salt trucks can access all areas as safely and efficiently as possible. If required, vehicles can be parked in municipal parking lots and will not be ticketed or towed.





Department SPOTLIGHT

Winter Storm of 2022

During the winter storm in December of 2022, the Town of Cobourg roads department worked around the clock. The Town of Cobourg declared a Significant Weather Event on Friday, December 23 due the continuation of high winds and blowing snow that led to multiple downed trees and wires and worsening road conditions.

Town Roads crews worked alongside, Parks staff, Lakefront Utility Services Inc. and contract workers from Ontario Line Clearing to clear downed trees and debris, repair traffic lights, assist crews reach residents without power and keep roadways accessible.

What is a Significant Weather Event?

A weather event that poses a danger to drivers and pedestrians is considered a Significant Weather Event. Municipalities can declare a "significant weather event" under the Municipal Act, 2001, Regulation number 239/02, relating to the maintenance of municipal roads, sidewalks and bike lanes. All roadways in the municipality are deemed to be in a state of repair with respect to snow accumulation and snow clearing activities will take longer than normal to complete.

- Road repair
- Catch basic inspection and clean-out
- Christmas tree collection
- Tree pruning
- Emergency locates

Planning Department Introduces New Development Dashboard

The Town of Cobourg Planning and Development Division developed a new Development Dashboard to help keep residents informed of active planning files in Town.

The Development Dashboard is a web-based map, powered by the Town's ArcGIS software. When visiting the webpage, residents can view all active development files taking place in Town. Applications are colourcoded by application type and mapped out showing the location of each project. Once selected, users can review conceptual drawings, and read additional details such as the project proposal. There is also a dashboard indicating upcoming Public Meetings and Open Houses that members of the community can attend if they have further questions on any of the listed projects.

"The Town of Cobourg is the largest and fastest growing urban centre in Northumberland County and the next largest urban centre heading east of the GTA on the 401 corridor," says Mayor Lucas Cleveland, Town of Cobourg. "In 2023, construction started on a total of 398 new residential dwelling units, approximately four times the amount of development activity experienced in recent years. Cobourg is a thriving community with dedicated



planning and development staff who work with applicants to increase the mix and supply of housing for our current and future residents while ensuring our local commitments such as sustainability, accessibility and heritage preservation are honoured."







Cobourg Council Approves 2024 Capital and Operating Budget

Project Highlights Include:



Hiring of a Sustainability Coordinator as recommended in the Town of Cobourg Integrated Community Sustainability Plan approved in 2023.



New Customer Service position to be rolled out mid-year 2024.



New auto extrication tools for the Cobourg Fire Department, replacing the previous set that is over 20 years old and is no longer reliable.



Fleet electrification for the Building Department and installation of two electric charge stations. Projects 100% funded by the Building Department's reserve fund with no impact to the levy.



Traffic signal intersection upgrade and accessible pedestrian signals. Costs shared with Northumberland County for shared intersections.



Bi-Annual Sidewalk Program - New sidewalks recommended for West side of Division Street from Veronica to Veronica, South side of University Ave W from Margaret to William, South side of Densmore Road from Division to Birchwood and North side of Elgin from D'Arcy to Conger.



Transit - a Limited Fixed Route Service Pilot Project one-year trial, in addition to the on-demand service.



William Street Bridge Rehabilitation - bridge inspections identified components of the bridge to be in poor condition or in need of rehabilitation work to meet current standards and practice.



Flashing beacons at King and College pedestrian crosswalk.



A dedicated team of Cobourg volunteers are exploring current grant opportunities for public electric vehicle chargers. Council has approved a Capital budget of \$120,000 should the grant application be successful.



Return of Tourism Students for summer 2024.



Council focused on improving public accessibility and quality of low-barrier outdoor activities by paving pathways at Fitzhugh Shores, Tracey Park, and Peace Park. New outdoor sports facilities will be added with two new basketball projects, a new disc golf course, and an expansion of rugby facilities.







A Message from the Mayor

Since taking office one of the most consistent calls I receive is regarding parking. It is an item I have spent a considerable amount of time discussing with my fellow Council as well as members of our local business community.

I want to be clear, parking is an important business for the Town of Cobourg. The revenues the Town receives from parking help offset our municipal services. Our residents know this because 1,688 of you contributed to the 2019 Beach Use Survey indicating that you wanted Council to "increase parking fees to offset the cost of infrastructure, beach maintenance and staffing requirements". However, while parking is an important revenue avenue we have to employ, it should not come at the expense of our local businesses or create an undue burden on our residents.

At the February 7th Community Services, Protection and Economic Development Standing Committee I passed a Notice of Motion asking Council to have staff rethink the parking situation in Cobourg. The suggestions presented in my motion are a combination of what I have heard from residents, local business owners and fellow Council members.

I would particularly like to thank Councillors Bureau and Darling who have compiled much research and resident feedback on this matter. They address the concerns raised by the DBIA and will provide a simplified application for parking in Cobourg, that does not impose a reduction of revenue but considers applications that will make parking more accessible for our residents and easier to understand for our visitors.

I am not an expert in parking. I just know you should not require a booklet to understand parking. So now, we have the ball rolling and staff will take it from here. I look forward to discussing this matter further so we can find a better solution for everyone.
