Town Closes All Outdoor Recreational Spaces During COVID-19 Pandemic

Under the direction of the Government of Ontario in an effort to stop the spread of COVID-19 and encourage residents to stay home, the Town of Cobourg has closed all outdoor recreational amenities and playgrounds until further notice.

All public outdoor recreational spaces in Cobourg (and across Ontario), including sports fields, tennis courts, off-leash dog park, beach, skateboard parks, picnic areas, outdoor community gardens and park shelters will be closed.

Town Makes Changes to Conventional and WHEELS Transit During COVID-19

In an effort to reduce the spread of COVID-19 and further protect drivers, passengers and our community during this pandemic conventional public transit will be limiting buses to eight passengers, enforcing physical distancing and keeping windows open to promote air flow.

WHEELS Transit will be limiting rides to one person or people from the same household, only taking bookings two days in advance and asking pre-screening questions prior to booking.
