Keeping in line with provincial restrictions for recreation and outdoor amenities, the Town of Cobourg has announced that the opening of both the Cobourg Marina and Victoria Park Campground will be delayed until May 29, 2020.

The public boat launch will also now be closed to the public and the boat lift-in is being re-scheduled for early June. Law enforcement will continue to patrol and provide assistance to the public.

A Message from the Cobourg Fire Department on Open-Air Burning

The Cobourg Fire Department has not issued a ban on Open Air Burning in Cobourg. A permit is not required for Cobourg residents to have a recreational fire, however you **MUST** abide by the rules outlined in Bylaw 058-2012.

Failure to adhere to the Bylaw may result in steep fines and/or you may be issued a response fee.

Please be advised that the Ministry of Natural Resource's fire ban on restricted zones 1-36 does not include Northumberland County.

YOU CAN



Go for a walk, run or bike ride through a park, path or boardwalk.



Walk your dog with members of your household.



Go for a scenic drive or bike ride.



Have a safe open-air fire in your backyard firepit.

Keep a 2-metre **physical distance** from others at all times.

YOU CANNOT



Play on any play structures, swings, slides or any park equipment.



Use a park, field or beach for any sports, play or recreation activities.



Gather in groups of more than five people.



Have individual or group activities such as picnics, games or play.



Use the skateboard park, dog park, tennis courts or sports fields.



Leave home if you are self-isolating or displaying symptoms.

Failure to adhere to these guidelines may result in tickets and/or fines.
