

## Paid Parking Resumes in Cobourg on March 4, 2021

**(Issued February 18, 2021 at 1:15 p.m. EST)** – The Town of Cobourg would like to advise residents that effective Thursday, March 4, 2021 paid parking will resume for all metered parking spaces and permit parking lots in the downtown core from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday to Sunday.

Due to COVID-19, Victoria Hall remains closed to the public until further notice, however parking permits can be [purchased online](#) to be used in Downtown Municipal Parking Lots where parking permits are permitted.

To purchase a permit online, you will be required to submit your license plate number and make of the vehicle. ### Download HonkMobile to Pay for Parking

In addition to the existing payment methods, residents can also use the [HonkMobile](#) app to pay for parking at any on-street parking meter with a smartphone, tablet or computer with web access. Here's how it works:

1. Find HonkMobile at [honkmobile.com](http://honkmobile.com), [Google Play](#) or the [App Store](#).
2. Set up your account. Add as many vehicles and payment sources as you like to your profile.
3. Use HonkMobile to pay for your parking in all Cobourg on-street parking meter locations.
