

### **The Lions of Fifth Avenue by Fiona Davis**

*A series of book thefts roils the iconic New York Public Library, leaving two generations of strong-willed women to pick up the pieces.*

The dual timeline follows Laura in 1913, wife to the superintendent of the newly built New York Public Library and her granddaughter Sadie in 1993, a special collection curator at New York Public Library. A series of book thefts in 1913 and now again in 1993 leave both women as persons of interest in the mysterious burglaries. Could there be a connection?

This new historical fiction novel by Fiona Davis is a professionally researched, fast paced historical fiction novel. The two-story lines were so beautifully written and the way they dovetailed together makes this a very satisfying read. In addition this novel details some interesting history of the iconic New York Public Library.
