



Town Remains Focused on Serving Community Keeping Staff Safe during COVID-19


The Town of Cobourg is carrying out extra precautionary measures to slow the risk of spread of COVID-19 by allowing some staff to work remotely whenever and whereever possible.

Managers have identified an approach that is flexible and also ensures critical municipal government services continue. Although most municipal buildings remain closed, staff are answering emails and responding to phone calls while also continuing to deliver services safely and effectively.

As we welcome a new season we do so by continuing to care for one another. I truly do miss connecting with you on the street, at events and public meetings. But I'm inspired by your resilient nature and how businesses, organizations, families and volunteer groups continue to contribute to a thriving Cobourg.

Planning & Development staff continue to work through a high volume of applications – a sign that developers are investing here, homeowners are committed to preserving our built heritage and folks are choosing to relocate for the next chapter of their lives.

We have numerous active files, including 13 subdivisions, 22 site plans and 5 affordable housing projects. The Comprehensive Zoning By-Law Review and Tannery District Sustainable Neighbourhood Master Plan are both expected to come before the public in early 2021. The Integrated Community Sustainability Plan and Green Development Standards project is in the RFP phase. Finally, following a recent public meeting for the Town's Affordable and Rental Housing Community Improvement Plan (CIP), Council will receive the final framework in the coming weeks. This exciting planning tool will create new financial incentives for developers, non-profits and individual homeowners to initiate projects that address our local affordable housing crisis.



Giving Back



Can you explain the light pattern at Elgin and Ontario Street? — Resident via phone call



This intersection spans a creek, which prevents easily widening it to include left-turn lanes. Previously, "blind' left turning increased the risk of collisions. As a result, the new setup allows one direction of traffic at a time, adding about an extra 30 seconds of wait time for drivers.


