COVID-19 Vaccinations Now Available for **Child Care Workers and Pregnant Women**

The Ontario Government recently announced an expansion to the COVID-19 Vaccination Booking System to include women who are pregnant and licensed child care workers.

In the coming weeks, eligibility will be expanded to include unlicensed child care workers.

Residents are encouraged to schedule an appointment as soon as you are eligible to receive a vaccination. The best vaccine is the first one you can get in your arm.
