Effective Saturday, April 3, 2021 at 12:01 a.m., a provincewide shutdown has taken effect for all of Ontario, including the HKPRDHU region.

Some of the new safety measures include:

- No indoor gatherings and limit of 5 for outdoor gatherings.
- Limiting in-store shopping capacity.
- No personal care services.
- No indoor and outdoor dining.

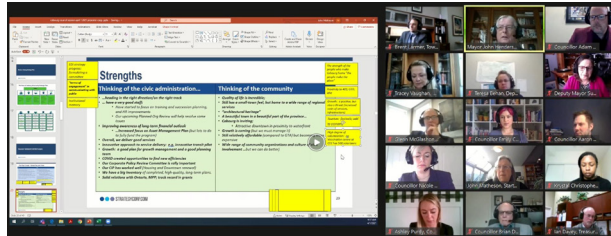

## Cobourg Rides On-Demand Transit System Launches Monday, April 19, 2021

### FAQ #1: How is on-demand transit different from traditional (fixed route) transit service?

**Answer:** Most transit services have fixed routes, bus stops and schedules. Buses must continue on the route even if there are no passengers. With the proposed on-demand service, passengers must request transportation in advance, which will stop at the curb next to their pick-up location. There is no set schedule and if there are no riders, the bus can be parked until there is a request for service, saving money and decreasing GHG emissions.
