On January 13, 2021 Council passed a motion to reduce the regular operating hours for WHEELS Transit as of Tuesday, January 26, 2021.

WHEELS Transit operating hours will be:

- Monday to Friday – 6:15 a.m. to 5:45 p.m.
- Saturday – 8:15 a.m. to 6:45 p.m.
- Sunday – 8:45 a.m. to 3:45 p.m.

The reduced hours will remain in effect until the Provincial 'Stay-at-Home Order' has been lifted.

Frequently Asked Questions - Enforcement



What is Deemed Essential to Leave Home?

You should only go out for necessities, such as getting food, beverages or medication, going to medical appointments, supporting vulnerable community members, child care, attending school, going to a bank, accessing government services, getting exercise or walking pets and going to work (if you can't work remotely).



Will the Police be Knocking on Doors to Ensure People are Staying Home?

The police have no power of entry into a private dwelling, unless authorized by law to do so. Police will not be checking whether individuals are in violation of the Stay-at-Home Order, unless it is warranted. Residents are asked to voluntarily comply with the government measures.
