



Richard B. Wright



Louise Penny



Terry Fallis


This deeply funny satire continues the story of Honest Angus McLintock, an amateur politician who dares to do the unthinkable: tell the truth.

MG Vassanji


Vikram Lall comes of age in 1950s Kenya, at the same time that the colony is struggling towards independence.

Isabel Allende


A heart wrenching and powerful story of an extraordinary woman who forges her identity and finds love and freedom under the cruelest of circumstances.




### The Paris Wife

Paula McLain






### American Dirt Jeanne Cummins

*American Dirt* will leave readers utterly changed when they finish reading it. A page-turner filled with poignancy, drama, and humanity on every page, it is a literary achievement.




### The Diamond Eye Kate Quinn

### Five Little Indians Michelle Good



Noelle Salazar


A stunning story about the Women Airforce Service Pilots whose courage during World War II turned ordinary women into extraordinary heroes.

### A Man Called Ove Fredrik Backman


Fredrik Backman's beloved first novel about the angry old man next door is a thoughtful exploration of the profound impact one life has on countless others.

Kelly Rimmer


